A Note from Fr. José Arroyo Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Last Saturday, we had a very good turnout at the annual Trivia Night. We had many parishioners and quests who attended and competed in a very fun night. This year, the proceeds will go to help fund our youth. They will travel this summer to Portugal with more than 200 pilgrims from our Diocese, including our bishop, priests, deacons, seminarians, religious brothers & sisters, and many others from our local parishes. One of the exciting aspects of World Youth Day is its international character where so many youth and young adults receive catechesis from bishops and church leaders throughout the world. This includes awesome concerts and other live events which integrate faith and culture. Of course, one of the expected highlights for this trip will be the pilgrimage to Fatima, the Marian site where God sent the Blessed Virgin Mary to three shepherd children and revealed a heavenly message of prayer and conversion. As summer approaches, let us continue to pray for our youth and help them financially according to our means. World Youth Day is usually celebrated every three years but has a life lasting effect.

Speaking of prayer and conversion, we will celebrate the beginning of the Lenten season with Ash Wednesday on the 22nd of February. We will celebrate a Mass at 8 a.m. & 7 p.m. Also, at 12 noon we will have an Ash Wednesday service with the liturgical readings and distribution of Holy Communion. Per the request of some parishioners during this Lenten season. I would like to offer the Saturday 9 a.m. Mass in English but ad orientem which in Latin means: "to the east." In our church, it would be a "liturgical east" as opposed to literally facing the east. This is the traditional posture of the priest. When Mass is celebrated in different Catholic Churches, the priest faces the east as he leads the rest of the congregation in prayer. Since the time of the early Church, the eastward direction of Christian prayer has carried a strong significance, attested by the writings of the Church Fathers. In the 2nd century, Syrian Christians hung a Christian cross on the eastern wall of their homes to symbolize "their souls facing God, talking with Him, and sharing their spirituality with the Lord." Two centuries later, Saint Basil the Great declared that "facing the east to pray was among the oldest unwritten laws of the Church." Most Christian apologetic tracts of the 7th century in Syriac and Arabic explicated the reason that Christians prayed facing the east is because "the Garden of Eden was planted in the east (Genesis 2:8) and that at the end of time, at the second coming, the Messiah would approach Jerusalem from the east." In continuity with this

tradition, you are all *welcome* on Saturdays at 9 a.m. to participate in the Mass, with the priest facing the east, and leading all towards Christ!


