A Note from Fr. José Arroyo

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Life is full of transitions and changes. This week we transition from the 7th week in Ordinary Time (which began after the Christmas season) to Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday. We will resume Ordinary Time after the Easter season, which ends on Pentecost Sunday. These different liturgical transitions serve as reminders to the entire Church that we are to keep in mind, throughout the year, the different mysteries of the life of Christ in order to better see our lives in the light of the Word of God, especially the Gospel.

Everyone is capable of following God's ways and becoming holy, no matter our age or cultural background. The Catholic Church, which is universal, treasures the totality of Divine revelation. Revelation was transmitted by Christ to the original apostles orally (Sacred Tradition) and before and after the Incarnation of Christ in writing (Sacred Scripture-Old & New Testaments). These two forms of Divine Revelation have been interpreted for two thousand years by the Magisterium pope and bishops in Communion with the pope in order to safeguard the deposit of faith. As we know, the bishops are the successors of the original apostles and the pope is the successor of the apostle St. Peter.

During the Lenten Season, the Church offers us spiritual disciplines in order for us to love God above all things and our neighbors as ourselves (for the love of God). The spiritual disciplines are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Prayer unites us to God; fasting disciplines our selfishness; and almsgiving allows us to be charitable. We fast on Ash Wednesday and eat no meat on that day or on any Friday of Lent. The goal is to love more, not less. At the end of the Lenten Season, we ought to be in the right relationship with God and our neighbors. In doing so, we should also be at greater peace with ourselves.

This Lent, we will try something new, per the request of some parishioners. We will celebrate Mass *Ad Orientem* on Saturdays at 9 a.m. We will do the same during the Spanish Sunday Mass at 2 p.m. This means that the priest will also face the Crucifix during the liturgy, especially the liturgy of the Eucharist as a sign that he leads all the faithful in prayer to God. He is not despising the people by giving his back, but rather he is leading us towards God.

In general, Lent is a season of intentional penance which should allow us to enter into a deeper conversion. Let us avail ourselves of the many opportunities to deny ourselves in order to live for God and accomplish His most perfect will!


Please join us this Sunday, February, 19th at 7:00 pm for Adoration and to pray the Holy Rosary with the Middle School and Youth Group.




Please bring in your blessed palms from last year so that we can burn them for ashes for Ash Wednesday.
