A Note from Fr. José Arroyo

Dear Brothers & Sisters.

We are blessed to welcome to our parish a successor of the Apostles, Bishop Kevin Carl Rhoades, who is bishop of our Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend! He has generously accepted the invitation to celebrate Mass at 10:30a.m. and spend some time of fellowship with all the parishioners at the Community Center. We will have coffee, donuts, and other delicacies, that includes tamales.

On Oct. 17, the Roman Catholic Church remembers the early Church Father, bishop, and martyr Saint Ignatius of Antioch, whose writings attest to the sacramental and hierarchical nature of the Church from its earliest days. Eastern Catholics and Eastern Orthodox Christians celebrate his memory on Dec. 20.

In a 2007 general audience on St. Ignatius of Antioch, the late Pope Benedict XVI observed that "no Church Father has expressed the longing for union with Christ and for life in him with the intensity of Ignatius." In his letters, the Pope said, "one feels the freshness of the faith of the generation which had still known the Apostles. In these letters, the ardent love of a saint can also be felt."

St. Ignatius was born in Syria in the middle of the first century A.D. Ignatius is said to have been personally instructed – along with another future martyr, Saint Polycarp – by the Apostle Saint John. It is quite an honor to be instructed by an original apostle. When Ignatius became the Bishop of Antioch around the year 70, he assumed leadership of a local church that was, according to tradition, first led by Saint Peter before his move to Rome.

Although St. Peter transmitted his Papal primacy to the bishops of Rome rather than Antioch, the city played an important role in the life of the early Church. Located in present-day Turkey, it was a chief city of the Roman Empire, and was also the location where the believers in Jesus' teachings and his resurrection were first called "Christians" (see Acts 11:26). And St. Ignatius of Antioch is the first church father to use of the term "Catholic Church" (literally meaning "universal church") in his Letter to the Smyrnaeans (c. 110 AD).

St. Ignatius makes references to the three-fold structure of the Church: bishop, priest/presbyter, and deacon. He gives instructions to obey the bishop, and a recognition that each city had only one bishop. As we welcome our own bishop, we thank God for the opportunity of his pastoral visit to our parish. I am honored to be your priest at St. Paul of the Cross, and to have a newly ordained deacon to assist me. May our love for the Eucharist continue to intensify in communion with our Catholic Church!
