A Note from Fr. José Arroyo

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, we come to the end of the Easter Octave. However, we continue our Easter season until Pentecost. There are many reasons for rejoicing at our parish. We had four confirmed during Easter Vigil and another received the Sacraments of Initiation at the hospital due to danger of death. However, the Lord has been very gracious and has allowed this new parishioner (13 years old) to recover and return home to begin treatments for brain cancer.

Mercy is the unmerited gift wrapped in kindness given to a person whose heart is full of misery. God is merciful beyond all telling. The word for mercy in Hebrew is: Hesed and in Latin: Misericordiae. The Incarnation is fruit of God's mercy and what made possible the Paschal mystery, which consisted of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. The Eucharist, which reenacts the mystery of Christ's merciful sacrifice on the Cross, allows God's merciful presence to meet our miseries. When we realize that in the Eucharistic celebration we are in the presence of the merciful Lord, we should ask Jesus for the grace to make the next good step in our spiritual journey so that we can be in the state of grace. For some, this may mean to approach a priest for the first time and go to confession. For others, it could be to begin speaking to a priest about an annulment process or to get a current civil marriage validated by the Church. Several parishioners have benefited from these processes already, and many more should know that the Church is here to walk with you. However, mercy does not exclude justice, especially with regard to Divine revelation or other people's rights. God's mercy considers

the whole picture and is geared towards full communion with Him and the Church.

May Our Lady of Mercy intercede for us in times of tribulations and temptations so that we may reflect the mercy of her Son who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.

family. Mark your calendars and plan to attend Holy Hour of Power on Friday, April 21st, from 6-7 PM.




