#### A Note from Fr. José Arroyo

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

This week is the most important of the liturgical year. We refer to it as "Holy Week." It is even more important than Christmas!!! However, it also coincides with the academic "spring break." Because of this break, many families are visiting elsewhere or visiting us from different places. We express a sincere heartfelt welcome to our visitors or natives who are back in town, and invite you to come to Mass as much as your schedule permits it, especially during the Easter Triduum!

This week we begin with Palm Sunday. The liturgy for this day has two parts. The first part is the triumphant entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem riding on a donkey as people have palms in their hands and shout with joy "Hosanna in the Highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord." The second part is the long reading of the Passion Narrative. Since liturgically we are in Year A, we read St. Matthew's account, next year-Year B (Mark's account) and the following year-

Year C (Luke's account). However, every year on Good Friday we always hear St. John's account. In this way, we listen to the Passion narrative from different perspectives.

On Holy Tuesday at 7 p.m., Bishop Kevin Rhoades will celebrate the annual Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. All are welcome to

this Diocesan-wide Mass. If you have never gone please try to go with your family and friends. It is a very special Mass where we priests renew our priestly promises and two types of sacred oils are blessed (Oil of Catechumens & Oil of the Sick) and one is consecrated (Sacred Oil). The latter one is used at baptisms, confirmations, holy orders (priesthood & episcopacy), and during the consecration of altars and chalices.

Lent comes to an end on Holy Thursday before the Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7 p.m. and this is also when the Easter Triduum begins. The Easter Triduum consists of Holy Thursday (institution of the Priesthood and Eucharist), Good Friday (passion, death, burial), and Holy Saturday (the morning is a time of mourning). However, at 9 p.m., it is a time of ecstatic joy at the Easter Vigil as we celebrate the reason we exist as Catholic Christians. During the Easter Vigil we will have four of our five RCIA members receive the rest of the sacraments of initiation, (not including baptism- which they have already received), and the exemption of two who will be conditionally baptized in private. One RCIA member will be baptized by Bishop Rhoades along with our youth (he is the ordinary minister of confirmation for baptized Catholics). The adults, who will make their Profession of Faith, will be confirmed and will receive the Eucharist for the first time, were not baptized as Catholics and one was not raised as one. Bishop has delegated me to confirm this latter one. In a word: there is reason for rejoicing!
