#### A Note from Fr. José Arroyo

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Last week, on *Laetare* Sunday, we had an amazing Lenten Parish Mission! On Sunday and Monday evening, Paul J. Kim shared so many important topics that were relevant to many parishioners and guests from different age groups and diverse backgrounds. We were able to learn in a very humorous and yet deep manner the importance of our faith in our day-to-day reality. On Tuesday evening, we had our Lenten Penance Service with several priests who generously gave their valuable time in order to become dispensers of Christ's mercy in Columbia City.

This Sunday, we begin "Passiontide," which will last two weeks: the week before Holy Week and Holy Week itself. On this Sunday, the crucifixes and statues are covered in the Church, except for the Stations of the Cross. The crucifixes will remain covered until the end of Good Friday, since on that day we commemorate the Lord's death on the Cross. However, the saint images will remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil. The reason for this coverage is to allow us to "fast" from beauty and focus dramatically on the Passion of the Lord that will unfold very soon during the Easter Triduum (which begins on Holy Thursday evening). No other devotions are to be emphasized during this time. At the Easter Vigil, we will experience an explosion of beauty with many natural flowers. By the way, this year, unfortunately no lilies were available for purchase this Easter. We will nevertheless have other flowers worthy of the liturgical celebration so there should be no need to worry.

As we approach the celebrations of Holy Week, I would like to make a reminder that this is the most important week of the liturgical year. We have a few candidates who are preparing for full communion with the Catholic Church. On the Easter Vigil (Holy Saturday at 9 p.m.), they will make an Profession of Faith and they will receive the sacrament of Confirmation and the Eucharist for the first time.

This is an exciting time for them but also for us! There are several others in RCIA that will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation from Bishop Rhoades at another time. This is baptized Catholic adults are to receive the sacrament of Confirmation ordinarily from the bishop, unless the bishop delegates it to the pastor, any other priest or another bishop. Because of the

importance of the reception of these brothers and sisters into full communion with the Catholic Church, we want to make an effort to be present and witness these transformative sacraments which will literally mark them for the rest of their existence. Hopefully, we welcome them personally. The Church is a family, and as such we should look forward to supporting each candidate in these important events!
