A Note from Fr. José Arroyo

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

We were delighted to welcome Bishop Rhoades last week as he celebrated the sacrament of Confirmation for so many of our youth (and one young adult) from two other parishes, namely St. John Bosco in Churubusco and Immaculate Conception in Ege. The newly confirmed learned recently that when they turn 16 years of age, they are eligible to become God-parents and Confirmation sponsors themselves (at least in theory).

So, what are the basic requirements that Godparents or sponsors have when they are selected? The Code of Canon Law (874) explains the following:

- Sponsors must be at least 16 years old.
- Sponsors must have received the sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist.
- Sponsors must not be a parent of the one to be baptized/confirmed.
- Sponsors must lead "a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on." [In other words, God-parents and Confirmation sponsors must be practicing Catholics in good standing.]

Some find it hard to explain to family or friends, who do not fulfill these requirements, the reasons why the Church requires them for the God-parents or sponsors. The short answer is that they are to serve as role models of the faith for the catechumens (non-baptized persons) or candidates (baptized but not confirmed). If they themselves have not received all three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation Eucharist), then they themselves need a Godparent or sponsor as they too need to complete their "initiation" as full-fledged Catholics. As the saying goes: "No one can give what he does not have." That does not mean that they are considered by the Church to be "bad people,"

simply a fully initiated Catholic is ideal. Although people can be "good," that is not enough when assuming the responsibility of becoming a Catholic God-parent or sponsor. For instance, if a person desires their children to learn a musical instrument, he will look for an instructor that knows about that specific musical instrument for the musical benefit of their children.

We pray for all the Confirmed and encourage them and their sponsors to persevere in the faith so that they may continue to be soldiers of Christ in the Church and in our world which desperately needs genuine heralds of the Gospel. Easter blessings!
