A Note from Fr. José Arroyo

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Our parish has been blessed with the recent visit and presentation of Tim Francis, a national speaker who passionately loves Christ and the Church. His love for the sacraments was so evident, especially the sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist. He considered the importance of being in the state of grace in order to receive the Eucharist worthily. This is key for the Eucharistic revival to take effect!

Likewise, last Wednesday our parish had the privilege of celebrating the 68th Priesthood anniversary of Monsignor Richard Zollinger. Monsignor is 94 years old and is a resident at The Waters nursing home Room 7 (in case you would like to send him a card). He shared a very beautiful testimony of his faith journey towards the ministerial priesthood of Jesus Christ. His family was in attendance during the 5 p.m. weekday Mass and was very appreciative for our sense of hospitality.

Thank you for all who attended and made this day very special for him and his loved ones.

This Sunday, during the 10:30 a.m. Mass, eight more children will receive the Holy Eucharist for the first of many times within their lifetimes. It is a great gift to receive our Lord. Many of them went received the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the retreat last week. One child was recently baptized after the retreat, although the child accompanied the rest of the class throughout the preparation.

In case you were wondering, our Diocese considers 8 years of age the cut-off before being considered a catechumen. In that case, an 8+ year old child would have to receive Confirmation and the Eucharist the same day he/she is baptized. However, did you know that a child who is not baptized should not go to Confession before baptism since baptism is the first sacrament that a Christian receives? An attempt to receive any other sacrament would actually be invalid, and inefficacious - a waste of time from a sacramental point of view. However, every baptized, including those receiving the Eucharist for the first time, will have the opportunity to go to sacramental Confession for the rest of their lives as long as they live a lifestyle that does not contradict a spirit of repentance, even if one grave sin is involved. This means that the moment in which a person intentionally does not repent from any sin, they cannot receive sacramental absolution from *any* sin. For instance, if people want to go to Confession, they can only do so if they repent from *all* of their sins. If they do not repent from even one sin none of them are forgiven. If one is guilty of a grave sin, one cannot receive Holy Communion. Reconciliation and Communion are linked. The awesome reality is that once we **repent** and **confess** *all* sins committed since the previous confession, they are *all* forgiven and the possibility of receiving the Eucharist is granted once again!
