A Note from Fr. José Arroyo

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

When I had the privilege of becoming your pastor and considered Parish Renewal, I needed the advice of many experts and I adopted a strategy to create teams to lead the ministries and apostolates here. The team concept allows us to bring people together with a variety of backgrounds, perspectives, and experiences to utilize the best everyone has to offer in order to create things that advance our parish mission and our cultural goals. You probably know that we, as a parish, have a Mission Statement. It's hanging in the Narthex. You might not know that we also have a Cultural Goal. That Cultural Goal includes the desire to "foster and develop a culture of joyful prayer, fellowship, teamwork, and alignment." Creating teams has aided in this goal.

The other obvious benefit of teams is that it lightens the burden of each individual. Many people are hesitant to sign up for ministry because they worry that the workload will be too great. Knowing that they are surrounded by a team that will distribute the responsibilities makes it easier for them to say "yes."

The team model has been very successful over the last year. Some examples of that success can be found in our Prayer Team, our RCIA Team, our Adult Religious Catechesis Team. All include members of various ages and unique faith journeys. All include members who have not previously served in a ministry at Saint Paul of the Cross. That is a beautiful thing! One of the first teams formed at Saint Paul of the Cross was the Moving Forward Team. These parishioners were very helpful early on as we began our ministry. In the near

future, you will meet members of some of our newer teams, such as our Eucharistic Revival Team. We have many wonderful events and programs planned for the coming year due to the willingness and dedication of the parishioners of Saint Paul of the Cross. These are just some of the examples of the teams that are currently at work to help renew our parish.

One of our greatest success stories is our St Vincent De Paul program. A team model was established in that apostolate, and now there are volunteers who help meet the needs of the less fortunate regularly in our community. The transformation has been so dramatic that the regional leadership for St Vincent De Paul is using our chapter as an example to inspire groups in other states.

Inspired by these successes, we are moving forward with our team model and have decided to re-envision our Youth Formation program at Saint Paul of the Cross. We are very grateful for the dedicated service that Anita Senesac and Stephanie Hamilton have provided to our parish for many years. However, the positions of Director of Religious Formation and Youth Minister have been combined into one new position. This position is titled Director of Youth Faith Formation and will oversee two teams; one that will lead PreK-8th grade formation and one that will lead High School Formation.

I am very excited to have a group of experts in the field of education (including administrators and teachers with many years of experience,) who will help us continue to creatively reimagine a program to serve the unique needs of the young people at Saint Paul of the Cross.

God eternally exists as the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
- 4 YOU RECEIVE HIM AT BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION**
We receive Him first in Baptism, and then is strengthened in the gifts of the Holy Spirit at Confirmation.
- 5 CHRISTIANS ARE TEMPLES OF THE HOLY SPIRIT**
We have the Holy Spirit indwelling in us. We must live accordingly.
