A Note from Fr. José Arroyo

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Last week, we had the wonderful experience of participating in an evangelization endeavor at the 4-H Fairgrounds along with St. Paul Street Evangelization. It gave us a beautiful opportunity to meet many people and run into people who would not have otherwise come to the church building. The Church exists to evangelize, and we have been asked by Pope Francis to go out to the peripheries of our social existence and bring the good news to the poor. However, poverty is not limited to the financially disadvantaged. It also includes the spiritually poor. People who are financially poor can still be suffering and starving spiritually. Some are never fed with the Word of God (Sacred Scripture or the Eucharist). We are very grateful for the opportunity to give such witness as disciples as we strive to make more disciples for the Kingdom of God. Some people decided to return to the faith within our parish community because of the sense of hospitality offered there by our evangelizers.

During this Eucharistic Revival at our Parish, we are to challenge ourselves to enter a deeper relationship with the Lord, especially in relationship to the sacraments. The Eucharist and Reconciliation are sacraments that go together and are to be received frequently and reverently. Both are to be received at least once a year. The lines for Holy Communion are often longer than the lines for Reconciliation. This is not unique to our parish. This could mean that most Catholics sin, but their consciences cannot recognize the sins that they've committed in order to confess them sacramentally. Another possibility could be that we think that we have reached a spiritual maturity in which we sin no more. In that case, we should be placed on the list of candidates to be canonized (as soon as we die) for lack of sins. The reality is that the canonized saints received both sacraments frequently. We who have been baptized most likely are not as virtuous as we should be, according to the state of life that God has called us to.

One of the ways in which we can renew our baptismal promises and receive the forgiveness of our venial sins (not mortal sins) is by being sprinkled with Holy Water. You may have seen a kettle in which a cleric has sprinkled Holy Water on you, whether at Mass or at a special blessing ceremony. However, you may have never heard what this liturgical item is called. The technical term is aspersorium. Additionally, the stick with a silver ball or hyssop branch that goes inside the aspersorium is called: aspergillum. The Biblical origin of the aspergillum is found in Leviticus "And the priest goes out of the camp and the priest looks and beholds that the sore of the leprosy of the leper is healed. And the priest commands, and takes, for the one healed, two unblemished live birds, cedar wood, Coccus scarlet, and hyssop. And the priest commands and slaughters the one bird in a pottery vessel upon living water. He takes the live bird and the cedar wood and the Coccus scarlet and the hyssop and dips them and the live bird in the blood of the bird slaughtered upon the living water. And sprinkle seven times upon him purified of leprosy, and he is purified, and sends the live bird upon the face of the field" (Leviticus 14:5-7).

Don't worry if you did not know these terms. Now you know. We are all still learning, including myself. God bless you and our parish family!
