Dear Brothers & Sisters,

On behalf of our youth and their parents I want to express my most sincere gratitude to all of our parishioners who spiritually and financially supported us at World Youth Day. The experiences lived in Portugal will have a life-long effect. Thanks be to God for the opportunity to celebrate our Catholic faith with so many pilgrims from literally all over the world, but most especially with the Holy Father.

Many of you have asked about the new Youth Faith Formation which includes two teams. One team will place their gifts and talents at the service of the children who are in the Pre-K thru 8th grade level. The other team will serve the youth in the high-school level. Both teams will be led by a director on staff. I desire to help parents to see their principal role in the faith formation of their children. It is the team's hope that parents will connect with each other and collaborate with the formation of their children throughout the year, not only during the academic year. Likewise, there should be a sense of ongoing formation in the youth after receiving the life of our Sacraments of Initiation, including Confirmation.

During this Parish Year of the Eucharistic Revival, we want to include all parishioners and guests in the process of Church renewal rooted in a deeper relationship with Jesus present in the sacraments, most especially in the Eucharist. We desire to see families continue to worship the Eucharist throughout the year


and the summer, wherever the Lord leads us on vacation or to special events. One of the ways in which we are learning more about our faith experience i

s by getting to know better the different liturgical items. During these upcoming weeks, I want to focus on the different liturgical books used throughout Mass.

First of all, it is important to recall that the Bible is the written Word of God and thus the ultimate set of guiding principles governing all areas of life for the people of God. Through writings, God communicates to these humanity His will, His laws, His nature, and His saving purpose. During the Mass, the priest, deacon, lector, and the assembly will use many different books as part of the celebration. The first book that I would like to introduce is the Roman Missal (also known as Sacramentary). It is a large and heavy book that contains all the words and prayers the priest uses during the Mass. You may notice that the altar servers hold it for the main celebrant at the priest's chair. Later it is placed at the altar for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

May our knowledge of the liturgy bring us closer to God who desires to communicate with us at every Mass and liturgical event!
