A Note from Fr. José Arroyo

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

This Saturday and Sunday we are celebrating the solemnity of St. Paul of the Cross. This is because our bishop grants permission for the pastors to transfer the patronal solemnity to the closest Sunday. To clarify once again the day on which we celebrate St. Paul of the Cross, the universal calendar celebrated it on October 19th. However, the church in the U.S. celebrated the Memorial of the North American Martyrs on October 19th. For this reason, St. Paul of the Cross's liturgical celebration has been transferred permanently to October 20th in the United States.

This year we will celebrate our patronal feast with a 40 Hour Devotion. We have a guest speaker who is very gifted and belongs to the Order of Preachers, better known as Dominicans. His name is Fr. Stephen Dominic Hayes, and he will join us for talks at 7 p.m. and many other liturgical events throughout the 40 Hours Devotion. This is a historic moment for the parish, and we should cherish the great opportunity by inviting other parishioners, family, and friends. We will be blessed to come together as a parish family and worship the One with whom we desire to spend all eternity.

Looking ahead, this year on All Hallow's Eve (Oct. 31), we will have a Vigil Mass at 7 p.m. followed by an hour of Eucharistic Adoration. We have the intention of making reparations for all the sacrileges committed against the Eucharist throughout the year, but most especially on Halloween. As people of faith, we uphold the unique dignity of Jesus present in the host. On Halloween, many satanists profane the Eucharist for "Black Masses" in which a consecrated host is desecrated. On the one hand, it is terrible that people profane the Most Blessed Sacrament. On the other hand, it is interesting that those who hate God and therefore Jesus and the Church, are indeed capable of still recognizing the real presence of Jesus although not for adoration. This reminds me of when the demons were capable of recognizing Jesus as the Son of God, but He would silence them (see Matthew 8:28-30). This means that it is not enough to recognize Jesus as the Son of God. Rather, we are to imitate Him by obeying Our Heavenly Father like the saints did. We celebrate the saints on November 1st.

Lastly, on November 2nd we will have two Masses for All Souls Day. The regular 8 a.m. Mass at the church and the 5 p.m. Mass at Greenhill Cemetery, preceded by 1 hour of Eucharistic Adoration beginning at 4 p.m. As a heads up, for the month of November we will not have a "saint of the month" but instead, we will have an "altar of the faithfully departed." For this reason, I would like to invite all families to find a small picture of a loved one who has passed away (this may include ultrasounds of unborn children who have gone to God) and bring them to the Church for display during the month of November. It is a good thing for all of us to keep in mind the faithful departed and pray for God's mercy upon them. Many blessings to all!


Plans are underway for Coats for Kids, 2024. The Knights of Columbus and the Salvation Army of Whitley County thank you for your support.




This Is My Body a call to eucharistic revival
