A Note from Fr. José Arroyo

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Last week we celebrated the Solemnity of All Saints (which was a Holy Day of Obligation) and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. As a reminder, if you happened to miss the Holy Day of Obligation, with no justifiable reason, you should go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation ASAP before receiving Holy Communion.

As I mentioned last week, during this month of November we will pray in a special way at each Mass for all of our deceased relatives and friends. For this reason, I invite all families to continue bringing more pictures of your loved ones who have passed away to pray for one another as a parish family. We also have the Book of Remembrance in the Narthex, so please feel free to continue adding names.

I also want to thank all our parishioners who have already made a contribution to the Annual Bishop's Appeal. This year we have a very convenient thermometer in the Narthex visually informing us of our progress as we strive for our \$33,232.41 goal. The good news is that we have already raised \$25,000. However, our greatest challenge is to have all families contribute in whatever way possible, because this way we will reach our goal. A suggested donation is to contribute 10% of your income to God and the Church or to give any tax-return if that is the case. By doing this you can subdivide it for different Catholic organizations, such as St. Vincent de Paul, Knights of Columbus, Mission Appeals, etc. Another suggestion is to contribute one month's worth of wage. Either way, the beautiful thing about being charitable is that God is never outdone in generosity.

If we think about the innumerable blessings God has allowed us to experience, we would actually be indebted to Him. As you know, any dollar amount that is collected beyond our goal is returned to our parish. This will help us cover the expenses of numerous Building & Maintenance projects, including sidewalks, improvements to our church boiler, furnace improvements, A.C. units, sound system, new asphalt on our parking lots, etc. Similarly, (and maybe more importantly), we should also financially invest in good Catholic resources such as national speakers that help spiritually nurture our souls so that we have the strength to continue evangelizing and bring many more people to Christ and the sacraments. Bringing speakers includes many costs, especially when airfare is involved and there are compensations equivalent to the quality of the presentations. It is easier to see the benefits of an investment of temporal goods versus the investment of spiritual goods. On that note, I ask you to continue to pray for us to soon find soon a Director of Youth Faith Formation and a Director of Sacred Music Thank you all for your generosity!
