GIVING TREE COMING

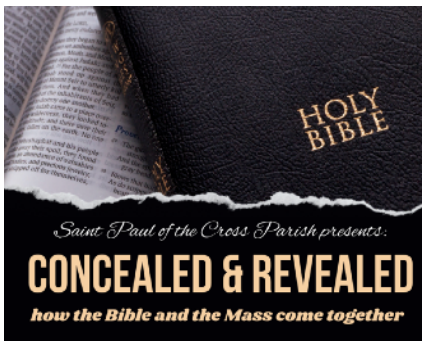
Christmas is just around the corner, and it's time to think about the "Giving Tree" at St. Paul of the Cross. In our efforts to help the less fortunate in our parish and community.

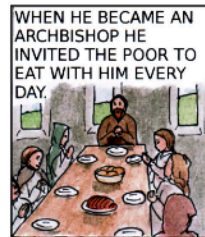
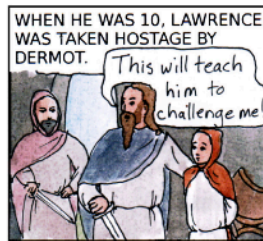
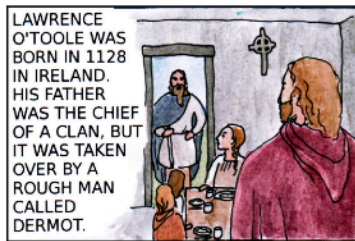
Catholic Q&A
